Welcome to the Autumn/Winter edition of the Accrington Road Runners newsletter. The days are getting shorter, so we are back to road running on a Tuesday evening. There has still been lots of racing taking place during the weekends including fell, road and trail events.

A big thankyou to everyone who was involved in the Accrington Road Runners 10km race on Sunday 29th October. We had lots of positive feedback after the race with lots of runners competing how supportive and cheerful the marshals were around the course. The annual AGM was held in October. Members had the opportunity to discuss how the club is run. We also welcomed our new president for the next 18 months - Dave Savage. The date of the AGM will be changed to March every year so it was decided Dave would be president for 18 months rather than reelect in 6 months. The club would like to thank Dave Sagar for his time as president over the previous year.

MEMBER PROFILE- DAVE SAVAGE

Dave joined the club in January 2017 after running the ARR 10km a few months earlier. He only took up running in his mid-thirties after he decided he would like to do the Liverpool marathon which he ran in May 2017. Dave became a regular runner for the club, competing in many races and taking part in team events such as the Bradford and Calderdale Relays. He was awarded most improved new member in his first year at the club. Dave started running in group 3 but quickly moved up to group 1 and later became a group leader. In 2022, Dave joined the committee as a welfare office then in October 2023 he was voted in as the clubs President. He is very much looking forward to taking this role on for the next 18 months.

Dave moved to Accrington in 2010 to take up a position of Geography teacher then later Head of Geography at Woodhey High school. He had previously worked as an outdoor instructor in Wales and USA and worked at a Pupil Referral Unit in Liverpool. He lives with his wife Jenny and 2 children. You will often see his daughter Pippa (aged 10) compete in junior races before her dad races! In September 2022 Dave had a career change leaving teaching after 15 years of being a classroom teacher to take up a new role as a Community Rail Officer. His main role is to lead a project called 'Feel Good Field Trips' on behalf of Avanti West Coast and to teach students about rail safety. He is also working on developing Accrington Eco Station.

Running is a big part of Dave's life. He has found it helps with his mental health especially during his days working at a busy high school. Dave found the running club a great way of making new friends after moving to a new town. He enjoys socialising with members at races and watching Accrington Stanley with a group of runners at the club.

Dave's favourite race was the Liverpool marathon. He enjoyed running past his beloved Liverpool FC (not so much going past Everton!) and lots of the major attractions of his hometown. Dave has also enjoyed taking part in trail and fell running over the past few years with the Brun Valley 10km one of his favourite.

RED ROSE CROSS COUNTRY

The Red Rose Cross Country League is a popular race series with our members. Formed in 1970 the league was set up to encourage competitive cross-country running in the local area. The league holds four fixtures each year, usually from October to December. A special thanks to Graham Morris who arranges race numbers and arrangements for these fixtures.

Fixture 1 - Vale Park. Todmordon

We had 21 runners (17 men and 4 ladies) competing in the first event of the season. Conditions were good, the course was tough with several climbs and descents with the usual mud!

Our men's team had their best finish with an impressive 2nd place finish overall including 5 men in the top 30. The ladies team finished 10th overall which was a great result considering we only had 4 ladies running.

Fixture 2 - Leverhulme Park, Bolton

17 runners took on this very muddy course which includes a river crossing and steep woodland climb.

The men's team finished 5th overall but an impressive 2nd in the Veterans race. The ladies improved from the last race at Todmorden and finished 8th overall.

Fixture 3 - Sefton Park

Another good turnout. 15 runners (12 men and 3 ladies) travelled by minibus travelled over to Liverpool to take part in this race.

Our men's team finished 6th overall with James, Glen and Josh all finishing in the top 20. Well done!

Fixture 4 - Marls Pitts

Unfortunately, due to freezing temperatures the last race in the cross-country series has been postponed until the 20th January 2024.

Holcombe Two Towers Race


 8 members took on this challenging course over Holcombe Moor. Glen and Joe won their age category. Well done!
